The **European Biotechnology Online Seminar Series** is dedicated to exploring the social, environmental, political and ethical dimensions of biotechnology in Europe.

Each seminar will bring two speakers into dialogue, offering their perspectives on new approaches, methods, and (good and bad!) experiences, developed to better-understand the place of biological science in the world today.

With speakers from both within and beyond ERA CoBioTech, the sessions will address topics covering the environmental, social and economic sustainability of biotechnologies; interdisciplinary methodologies for collaboration across the social and natural sciences; the relationships between science and citizens; the institutional lessons from funders and larger research centres; as well as practical lessons from researchers at the interface of science, technology and society.

The seminars will run **weekly** from 30 September 2020 at **14:00-15:00 CEST** (full programme below). **On the 21st of October at 18.00 CEST**, we will also be running the first ever **CoBio Tavern** - a virtual pub to enable informal discussion and networking among the participants and the speakers.
